D6/JUST4FUN RULES & NOTES

Thank you for participating in Rose City Futsal's Coed D6/Just4Fun League! We're excited to have this option for players looking for a different level of competition and hope you enjoy the league.

COED D6 LEAGUE RULES & NOTES:

- There are no Final Scores (All Games will be entered as a 0-0 tie) clock will be ran and score
 count kept during game but in the end recorded as 0-0
- Ringer Rule If a "ringer" is identified, please coordinate with the front desk and we will
 highlight the player and follow up with the team manager (at halftime or end of the game)
- 3 cap goal limit for all players within Coed D6

GENERAL PRINCIPLES:

1. Avoid Physical Contact

- No intentional physical contact, including tackling, pushing or body-checking
- Can defend with arm up but once it becomes extended it is considered unnecessary or excessive
- Players must maintain a safe distance when challenging for the ball.

2. Shielding:

 Players can shield the ball but must avoid using excessive force or making contact to maintain possession.

3. Challenges for the Ball:

- Challenges must be made for the ball only, without any risk of contact with the opposing player
- Slide tackling is prohibited

4. Incidental Contact:

 Any incidental contact is closely monitored by the referee. Excessive or reckless play may lead to penalties.

PLAYER BEHAVIOR:

1. No Aggressive Play:

- Aggressive movements, such as swigging arms or forcefully boxing out opponents, are prohibited.
- Players must do their best to avoid collisions.

2. Respect Opponents:

- Respect for the opposing team is emphasized. Players must avoid any actions that could lead to
 physical conflict.
- An understanding amongst all team managers and players that this is D6 Just for Fun.

Referee's Role - PLEASE NOTE:

- Our referees are subcontracted through Northwest Indoor Soccer and we encourage you to
 provide both positive and negative feedback on their performance. Visit our website

- Referees are to enforce non-contact rules strictly
- They prioritize player safety, intervening immediately when physical play escalates.
